Meet our Seasonal Ranger

We are pleased to announce we have appointed Toni Lamont as our Seasonal Ranger for 2025. Welcome to the Team, Toni!

"When I was 16, I began volunteering with my local countryside ranger service which sparked my love of nature and led to my work in conservation. I started off as a Junior Ranger, where I got my first opportunity to learn about the many species that exist in our woodland habitats, which kind of blew my mind and opened up a whole new world of possible careers for me. That experience encouraged me to become a modern apprentice ranger for the North Ayrshire Ranger Service. I then went on to study and get a degree in Wildlife and Conservation Management. Since then I have worked as a ranger all over Scotland, from the bonnie banks of Loch Lomond to the beautiful caledonian pine forests of the Cairngorms. I find rangering to be a very rewarding job as I get to be the link that supports each person's connection to nature. That could be from leading a guided bat walk to conducting a citizen science project or patrolling to increase people's awareness of the Scottish Outdoor Access Code. I can't wait to start my season with the Loch Ken Trust. Having recently moved to Galloway, I am looking forward to putting down roots and contributing to my community. Keep an eye out for me around Loch Ken, don't be afraid to say hello!"


Local Food Resilience




