Boat Registration



Loch Ken Trust have ceased to run a boat registration scheme from the Loch Ken public slipway, Boat O Rhone, from April 1st 2025, due to increased multi usage and safety concerns.

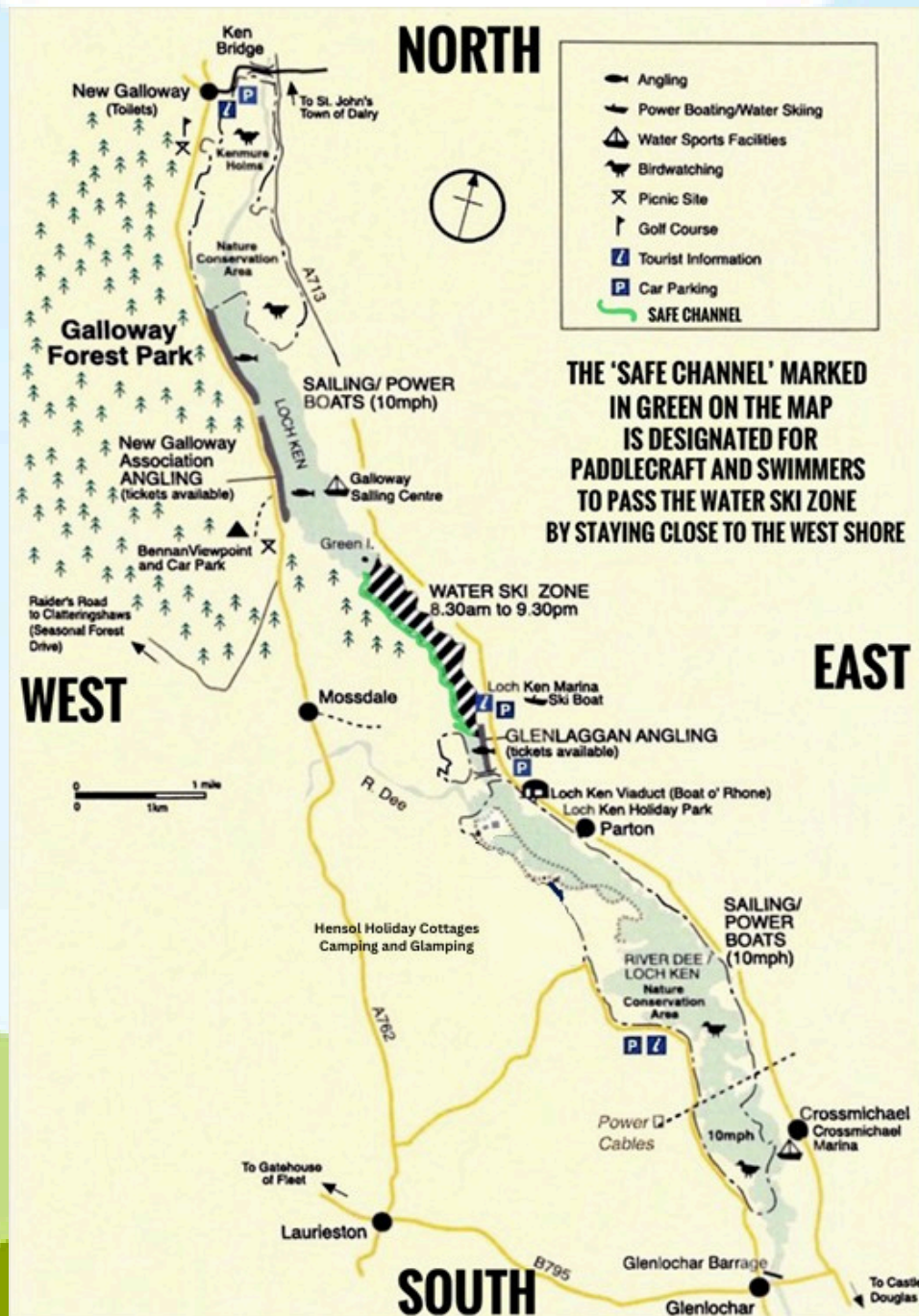

Please be aware that there is a High Speed Zone on Loch Ken. There is a designated channel where paddlecraft can pass, avoiding the High Speed Zone by staying close to the West Bank.

It has been a busy month for our Rangers who have continued patrolling during the holiday season.

We have embarked on joint patrols with Scottish Fire and Rescue Service during the very High Wild Fire Risk, educating loch users on the risks of open fires during these periods.

It is really important to take all your equipment away, even if damaged. It might not be clear whether there are missing persons and if the emergency services need to be alerted.
